THE CAUSE AND CURE OF CONFLICTS AMONG PEOPLE

In any community and any human organization, conflicts are inevitable to occur. It all began in the Garden of Eden where the first human pair lost their perfect peace and comfortable existence because they were tempted to choose a way of life that was contrary to God's plan for them.

Jean Baker Miller, a prominent psychiatrist, says that conflict begins at the moment of our birth. In other words, we are the cause of conflict. Walt Kelly was right when he said. "We have seen the enemy, and they are us." This often-quoted line is undisputably correct because it is in harmony with what the Bible teaches. The Apostle James asks, "What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from desires that battle within you?" (James 4:1).

In the following 2 verses, we get the answer, which is not very surprising. When unconverted and impenitent sinners desire to have what they don't possess, their covetousness and greed will cause squabbles and altercations They will have no inhibitions for committing horrible and violent acts because their motivation is entirely selfish. They will grab, through illegal means, what others rightfully own, in order to provide instant gratification for their illegitimate desires and evil passions.

These innate impulses are demonstrated by little children who throw tantrums when their parents do not give them what they want, when they want it. In malls and grocery stores, you have probably seen rebellious kids screaming and kicking because their parents have shown resistance to complying with their unrestrained urges for buying candy or toys. I have witnessed such ugly scenes that have caused unwarranted embarrassment to parents.

Unfortunately, conflicts caused by human greed and the inordinate desire to attain power and influence, have been a part of the tragic history of our fallen human race. The result of a research study that was reported by the **Canadian Army Journal**, shows that since 3600 B.C., our world has known only 292 years of peace! The proven history of our world ought to be a warning to us that the current polarization and divisiveness that exist among individuals and nations could lead to unmitigated disasters

Apparently, we cannot prevent conflicts from happening in our world, but we can keep them out of the church. In the remaining verses of chapter 4, of the Epistle of James, we are told what steps to take to avoid this nasty problem that is plaguing the world.

Submit yourselves to God (James 4:7).

The submission referred to here involves obedience to God's commandments, and an unwavering surrender of ourselves to God's will. We are encouraged to trust what God says as a little child trusts his/her parents.

The greatest challenge that Christians face today is to live in the world without being of the world. We have to exert every effort to influence the world without being adversely affected by its corruption and corrosive customs. It is always difficult to swim upstream and reject the adoption of worldly standards that are not approved by Jesus Christ.

Come near to God and He will come near to you (James 4:8).

If you seek the Lord with all your heart and true sincerity, you will eventually find Him. He is not hiding from you; on the contrary, He is waiting patiently for you to return to Him in penitence and humility. Jesus has promised to never cast out those who seek His help.

Lynn Buzzard, who was Professor of Law at Campbell University, gives us judicious advice to help us resolve relational conflicts.

1. Control your feelings and prevent

- them from exploding like a volcano.
- 2. State your concerns clearly to help your opponent take practical action to resolve the dispute.
- 3. Do not assume that you know all the facts surrounding the dispute. Never say that your position is totally right because such an attitude will block the road that leads to reconciliation. Be humble enough to accept some blame for the disruption of the relationship.
- 4. Refrain from doing all the talking. Give time to your opponent to explain his/her point of view. Listen carefully to the clarifications that the opposing party will make.
- Do not cling tenaciously to all the evidence you have assembled that shows the other person is completely wrong. During an open and honest discussion, you may realize that some of your facts were mere assumptions.
- 6. Do not judge the motivation of the other party because that might bring the dialogue to an abrupt end.
- 7. Do your utmost to find a win/win solution that will be satisfactory for everyone involved. Never pursue a win/lose strategy because if the opposing party perceives that they gained nothing, the desired restoration of friendly ties would not be achieved.

At the height of the Civil War conflict, when President Abraham Lincoln was asked if he thought he might fail, he replied by saying, "Without God, I cannot succeed; with God, I cannot fail."

The Lord whom we worship and follow is called "The Prince of Peace" who admonishes us to be promoters of peace through the practice of unselfish love.. In 2 Corinthians 5:18, we are told that God, through Christ, has given us the **Ministry of Reconciliation**. The mission of all Christian believers is to help people be reconciled with God and with one another. Our primary goal ought to be replacing hate with love and dissension with unity.




