PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Church members & Supportive Friends,

There is nothing quite like chocolate chip cookies. They come in all shapes and sizes, but they are very similar in how they are made. There is the flour, sugar, butter, eggs, vanilla and, of course, chocolate chips. All these ingredients blend and work together to form the chocolate chip cookie.

The church resembles a chocolate chip cookie, with many ingredients, but making up something that is much bigger than the individual parts. Just as the various ingredients of a chocolate chip cookie exist in the cookie, so we exist in the Church. The ingredients were baked to form the chocolate chip cookie, so we were baptized to form the body of Christ, which is another name given for the Church.

What is an important ingredient in a chocolate chip cookie? What if we left out the flour because we are not baking a "flour cookie?" We cannot leave out anything. The chocolate chip recipe lists specific ingredients, in a specific order, with precise quantities, for a good reason. Too much of one ingredient, or not enough of another affects the composition and the taste of a chocolate chip cookie.

In 1 Corinthians 12:12-31,the Apostle Paul likens the church to a human body that has no unimportant part. The foot, by



itself, may not be able to play the piano, but without the feet, the hands will never get to the keyboard of the piano. God, in His infinite wisdom, has designed every part of our body to perform a unique function. Without the hand, the body cannot pick up an object that the eyes see. No part of the human body is insignificant. In a similar way, there is no insignificant job in the church. Evervone who works for the betterment of the church plays an important role in keeping the church body in a healthy and vibrant condition.

We are able to operate the church smoothly and efficiently because all the communicant members perform a vital role, and make a significant contri-

bution to the mission of the church by dedicating their talents to God's service. Like the different ingredients that make up a chocolate chip cookie, every member adds a special flavor to the church. As members of one body, we have to remain united to retain our vitality. Although we have different talents, and perform different roles, we are all interdependent because we are connected together. It is very important that the various members of the body retain their cohesion; otherwise, the body would be incapacitated and crippled.

I would like to encourage you to evaluate your gifts, abilities and talents in order to find a particular ministry that suits you. After finding your special niche in the church, it is essential that you make a commitment to perform your duty at your maximum potential. God needs all of you, and the church would be impoverished if we were to lose anyone of you. The chocolate chip cookie would not retain its delicious taste if anyone of its ingredients is left out. Instead of pulling apart, let us pull together as a united team.




GRADUATES



THIS 'N THAT

From Our Kitchen to Gours - Heavenly Recipes

HEALTHY CHICKEN CASSEROLE

Submitted by Rosemary Saatjian

Ingredients:

- 2 cups wild rice, cooked according to package
- 2 Tbls olive oil
- 1/2 onion, chopped
- 2 medium sweet potatoes, peeled & cubed small
- 1 lb brussel sprouts, trimmed & quartered
- 1 tsp dry thyme
- 1/2 tsp garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 1/2 tsp ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup chicken broth
- 2 lbs boneless, skinless chicken thighs (can use meat from one rotisserie chicken)
- 1/2 cup dried cranberries
- 1/2 cup sliced almonds (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9 x 13 baking dish. Heat 1 Tbls olive oil. Season chicken with pepper and cook 6-8 min per side or until cooked through. Cut into bite size pieces. In large skillet, heat oil and add onions, sweet potatoes & brussel sprouts. Season with remaining seasonings. Sauté slightly until softened, about 5 minutes. Add broth, simmer & cover for 5 minutes. Mix in prepared rice, prepared chicken and cranberries. Transfer mixture into baking dish and top with sliced almonds. Cover and bake for 20 minutes. Enjoy!!
