THE GOOD NEWS OF CHRISTMAS

1. The birth of Christ dispels all fears.

The angel said to the shepherds, "Do not be afraid" (Luke 2:10). The shepherds of Bethlehem had many fears; They were afraid of marauding wolves and lawless bandits. They also feared the Roman soldiers who harassed them occasionally. Naturally, the shepherds were terrified when they saw the glory of the heavenly angels. The Baby who was born in Bethlehem specialized in making all fears vanish from the hearts of humans.

2. The birth of Christ brings great joy.

The angel told the shepherds, "I bring you good news of great joy" (Luke 2:10). The shepherds were the loneliest people in the Holy Land. Because of their job, they were deprived from attending social gatherings and religious services in the local synagogues. They spend all their time watching over their flocks, caring for their needs and guarding them. They were shunned by most people because they were uneducated, unsophisticated, physically dirty because they seldom bathed. They were also considered to be spiritually unclean because they worked seven days a week and, consequently, they could not observe the weekly Sabbath. The way they were treated by society made them very unhappy, bitter and depressed. They greatly rejoiced when the angel assured them that a Savior was born who would replace their sorrow with joy.

3. The birth of Christ breaks down the walls of discrimination.

The angel told the shepherds, "I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all people" (Luke 2:10). The shepherds were subjected to discrimination on a daily basis. Generally, people were suspicious of them and accused them, often unjustly, of being liars and thieves.



The word of assurance from the angel that the good news of Christ's birth is not only for the rich and famous, but for all people, including the poor and lowly, gladdened the shepherds' hearts. The grace of God has been extended even to the Gentiles and to all people who will believe in Christ. That's why the Apostle Paul declares in Galatians 3:28,"There is now no distinction between Jew or Gentile, slave and free, male and female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

4. The birth of Christ expresses God's personal touch.

The angel told the shepherds, "A Savior has been born to you" (Luke 2:11). One of the names given to Christ is Immanuel which means "God is with us." During the Old Testament period, God delivered His

messages through prophets like Moses, Isaiah and Jeremiah, but when Christ was born, He communicated His message to the people directly through His Son, Jesus Christ.

5. The birth of Christ brings salvation.

The angel said to the shepherds, "Today, in the city of David, a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11). The ancient Jews envisioned the Messiah to be a warrior who would liberate their land from Roman rule, and conveniently forgot that His primary mission is spiritual; He came to seek and save the lost by liberating them from the tyrannical rule of sin. John the evangelist says, "As many as received Him (Jesus), to them He gave the right to become children of God" (John 1:12).

6. The birth of Christ brings peace.

The night when Christ was born, the angelic choir sang, "Glory to God in the highest, peace to men on whom His favor rests" (Luke 2:14). One of the results of redemption is having peace with God through reconciliation. Because we are connected to Christ by faith, we are no longer the enemies of God but have become His friends and His adopted children.

During the upcoming Advent Season, let us not forget to express our deep gratitude to God for having given us Heaven's most precious gift, His Son Jesus Christ. That's why the Apostle Paul jubilantly exclaims, "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift" (2 Corinthians 9:15).

RALLY SUNDAY


