The MasterCard Versus the Master's Card

Dear Church Members & Friends,

I would like you to consider the vast differences that actually exist between a **MasterCard** and **the Master's Card**. The two phrases sound similar, but they mean very different things:

1. MasterCard

A financial product: It's an international credit/debit card brand, issued by banks.

Purpose: Used for payments, purchases, ATM withdrawals, online transactions. It's about money, finance, and commerce.

2. The Master's Card

A spiritual or symbolic phrase, not a literal credit card.

"The Master" here refers to Jesus Christ.

Meaning: Instead of relying on a man-made card (money, credit, debt), a believer relies on God's promises, grace, and a spiritual "account" that never runs out. It high-

lights God's eternal riches versus earthly wealth.

The MasterCard is a temporary, man-made, financial credit. The Master's Card gives you access to eternal, divine and spiritual blessings.

The world offers us a MasterCard— a small piece of plastic that opens doors to shops, travel, and entertainment. It comes with limits, interest, and debt; if you use it unwisely, it enslaves rather than frees. It can be lost, stolen, or declined.

But heaven offers us **the Master's Card**—stamped not with numbers, but with the **blood of Christ**.

It opens not earthly stores, but the treasures of God's kingdom.

It carries **no expiration date**, for His mercies are new every morning and never fade away.

There are no finance charges and no hidden fees, only UNLIMITED GRACE.

And instead of debt, it proclaims, "Paid in full" (John

19:30). It's a prepaid deal! With a MasterCard, you buy what perishes.

With the Master's Card, you receive what is eternal.

One leaves you with monthly bills; the other leaves you with everlasting peace.

So carry the Master's Card today.

Use it often—in prayer, in faith, in acts of love.

Its credit never runs out, because its source is Christ Himself, who is "able to supply all your needs according to His riches in glory" (Philippians 4:19).

I would like to encourage you to become a card carrying representative of the Master's Card which is accessible 24 hours a day from anywhere in the world and start reaping its numerous benefits. Even if your credit score is dismal; you can't be rejected because the Master says, "Whosoever comes to Me, I will never cast out."

Women's Spiritual Fellowship


You're invited to the Women's Monthly Bible Study.

- 3. Parking lot netting repaired.



From Our Kitchen to Yours - Heavenly Recipes

RED LENTIL SOUP

2 cups red lentils

4 tablespoons rice

2 large onions, chopped

2 carrots, chopped

3 stalks of celery, chopped

2/3 stick butter

1/2 teaspoon paprika

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

1 tablespoon salt (add more to taste)

4-6 cups water or chicken broth

In a large pot, combine all ingredients and cook on a low heat for 1 –2 hours or until the lentils dissolve. <u>Stir frequently</u> to prevent sticking. Add more water/broth if needed. It should have a thick consistency, but still soupy. Serve immediately or refrigerate. Serves 6-8 good size portions.
